

AN ORDINANCE

Granting permission to the York Telephone Company to construct a Telephone Line on the public ways of the Borough of Goldensboro York County, Pa., and providing the conditions on which the same can be constructed and maintained.

SECTION 1.—Be it ordained by the Borough of Goldensboro York County, Pa.: That permission be and is hereby granted to the York Telephone Company of the City of York, Pennsylvania, its successors and assigns, to construct, operate and maintain a Telephone Line, including the necessary poles, wires and fixtures, upon, along and over the highways of the Borough of Goldensboro aforesaid, as its public use may require in such manner as not to obstruct the public use of the highways, provided that the poles shall be reasonably straight and neat in appearance and of sufficient height to carry the wire twenty five feet above the ground, and shall be located under the supervision of the Street Committee of the Borough.

SECTION 2.—All poles erected under this Ordinance shall be erected as directed by said Street Committee, and said Company shall replace and properly relay any sidewalk or street pavement which may be displaced by the location and erection of the poles.

SECTION 3.—Said Company shall at all times be subject to the Borough ordinances now in existence or which may be hereafter passed relative to the use of public streets or other public places.

SECTION 4.—Nothing in this ordinance contained shall be construed so as to grant unto said Company the exclusive right, or to prevent the grant of similar privileges to other individuals or companies for like purposes on the highways of said Borough.
