An Ordinance

AN ORDINANCE LAYING OUT, OPENING AND ADOPTING SECOND AVENUE BETWEEN FRAZER STREET AND FISHING CREEK AND PROVIDING FOR THE ASCERTAINING OF DAMAGES AND BENEFITS CAUSED THEREBY.

Section 1: Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, that Second Avenue, between Frazer Street and Fishing Creek in said Borough of Goldsboro be, and the same is hereby laid out, opened and adopted as a public highway of said Borough, the same to be of the uniform width of twenty (20) feet and according to the following courses and distances, to wit:

The center line of said twenty feet wide alley, beginning at a point, an iron pin, which said point is 211 feet Westward from the South West Corner of Frazer Street and South York Street, and extending thence through lands of George F. Ottmyer, Ninety-four and Forty-Five Hundreds 94.45 Feet to land of D. L. Kunkel, thence through land of said D. L. Kunkel, Two Hundred Twenty-Seven and Sixty-Three Hundredths 227.63 Feet to the North Bank of Fishing Creek.

A plot of said Second Avenue, as above described, is hereby attached and made part of this ordinance.

Section 2: The damages and benefits, if any, accruing from said improvement shall be ascertained in the manner prescribed by law.
