

Ordinance No. 23

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Council of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, in session met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be unlawful for any person, or co-partnership, or association, or corporation within the Borough of Goldsboro, from the date of the approval of this ordinance to sell, expose or offer for sale, discharge or fire, or use or set off, or explode any rocket, torpedo, roman candle, squib, fire crackers, sparkler, or other fireworks or any kind, or any substance or explosive intended for pyrotechnical display, without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Burgess or other designated officer.

Section 2. Any person, or co-partnership, or association, or corporation that shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof under summary proceedings instituted before any Magistrate, Alderman or Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, or to be imprisoned in the County prison not less than one day nor more than ten days, or either, or both, at the discretion of the trial officer.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances incontest herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE No. 23

An Ordinance providing for the Use or Sale of Certain Explosives, etc.



Section 1. Be it enacted by the Council of Goldsboro Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, in session met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be unlawful for any person, or co-partnership, or association, or corporation within the Borough of Goldsboro, from the date of the approval of this ordinance to sell, expose or offer for sale, discharge or fire, or use or set off, or explode any rocket, torpedo, roman candle, squib, firecrackers, sparkler, or other fireworks of any kind, or any substance or explosive intended for pyrotechnical display, without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Burgess or other designated officer.

Section 2. Any person, or co-partnership, or association, or corporation that shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof under summary proceedings instituted before any Magistrate, Alderman or Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding (\$50.00) Fifty Dollars, or to be imprisoned in the County prison not less than one day nor more than ten days, or either, or both, at the discretion of the trial officer.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
