

ORDINANCE NO. 84-3

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANIMALS FROM RUNNING AT  
LARGE WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF GOLDSBORO.

BE IT ENACTED and ORDAINED by the Borough Council of Goldsboro Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby Enacted and Ordained by the Authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for the owner, custodian, or any person to allow horses, ponies, cattle, sheep or goats to run at large within the Borough of Goldsboro at any time, either upon any street, alley, public ground or private property, other than the property of the owner, custodian or keeper of such animal.

SECTION 2: The Mayor may authorize any such animal running at large to be seized and held by the Borough. Notice of such seizure shall be sent to the owner, custodian or keeper of such animal by certified mail or personal notice, and such animal may be redeemed by the owner, custodian or keeper within ten (10) days from the receipt of such notice, upon payment of charges incurred by reason of the seizure and detention. Furthermore, the owner, custodian or keeper shall be required to pay for reasonable damages caused by such animal running at large to property. Any animal not redeemed within the specified time may be disposed of by sale by the Borough. Any monies realized from such sale shall be applied to the expenses incurred by the Borough for the seizure and detention and then to damages to property, if any, and any remaining money shall inure to the benefit of the Borough.

SECTION 3: Any owner, custodian or keeper of any of the

aforesaid animals who shall violate the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction before a District Magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$300.00 together with the cost of prosecution, and in default thereof, be sentenced to imprisonment in the York County Prison for a period of not more than thirty (30) days. The aforesaid fine shall be in addition to, and separate from, the right of the Borough to collect the cost of the seizure and detention and damage to property.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
