

GOLDSBORO BOROUGH
ORDINANCE NO. 2005-2

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF GOLDSBORO, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15, PART 3 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING THERETO A NEW SECTION PROVIDING FOR THE PROHIBITION OF PARKING VEHICLES OR PLACING OBSTRUCTIONS WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY ALONG CERTAIN PORTIONS OF RAILROAD STREET.

WHEREAS, the Goldsboro Volunteer Fire Company and Ambulance Service has informed Borough Council that it is not possible to drive emergency vehicles on Railroad Street from Zeigler Street to North Avenue when vehicles are parked or other obstructions are placed within the public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Goldsboro Borough to allow for emergency vehicles to have unimpeded access through all public rights-of-way in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council of Goldsboro Borough desires to prohibit parking vehicles or placing obstructions within the public right-of-way along Railroad Street between Zeigler Street and North Avenue so as to insure the free and safe passage of emergency vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it enacted and ordained by the Borough of Goldsboro Borough as follows:

Section 1. Repeal. Chapter 15 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Part III (General Parking Regulations), Section 15-303 (Penalties) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. Amendment. Chapter 15 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Part III (General Parking Regulations) of the Code of Ordinances) is hereby amended by adding of the following sections:

§15-303. Parking prohibited at all times in certain locations. Parking shall be prohibited at all times in the following locations:

Street

Side

Between

Railroad St.

Both

Zeigler St. & North Ave.

§15-304. Penalties. Any person who violates any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15.00 and costs. Provided: it shall be the duty of the police officers and of parking enforcement personnel of the borough to report to the appropriate official all violations of any provision of this Part indicating in each case: the section violated; the license number of the vehicle involved in the violation; the location where the violation took place; and any other facts that might be necessary in order to secure a clear understanding of the circumstances attending the violation. The police officer or other person making the report shall also attach to or place upon every such vehicle a notice stating that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part.

Section 3. Repealer. All ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on March 1, 2005.




