

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF A
SEA WALL IN THE BED OF FISHING CREEK
IN THE BOROUGH OF GOLDSBORO, YORK
COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same as follows:

WHEREAS, Fishing Creek is a stream running through the Borough of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, and

WHEREAS, flooding has caused damage to a sea wall approximately eight feet in height, twenty inches in width and a length of approximately five hundred and seventy feet, with the damaged area beginning approximately twenty feet from the Penn Central Railroad bridge, and

WHEREAS, the said sea wall is within the bed of Fishing Creek, and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Goldsboro has applied to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, Federal Disaster Assistance Administration for federal financial assistance in repairing the said wall,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Borough Council of the Borough of Goldsboro, that if the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration grants financial assistance in the approximate amount of One Hundred and Seventeen Thousand (\$117,000.00) Dollars for the repair or replacement of said wall, that after such repair or replacement of the wall and upon payment thereof from the federal financial assistance, the Borough of Goldsboro shall and will be responsible for the maintenance of the said wall for any

damage or wear from normal conditions.

The foregoing Resolution having been processed in accordance with law is hereby sustained this ^{9th} day of February, 1976, at a meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Goldsboro.
