

Resolution # 85-1

WHEREAS, the Federal Revenue Sharing Program has been authorized by Congress to extend through September, 1986, and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Goldsboro relied heavily on Federal Revenue Sharing payments to sustain our budgeting for municipal services; and

WHEREAS, termination of Federal Revenue Sharing revenues will necessitate either substantial increases in local taxes to replace the lost revenues or elimination of some of our basic municipal services, including police protection; and

WHEREAS, Federal Revenue Sharing payments has been the only consistent source of Federal aid received by our borough through the years; and

WHEREAS, the 1985-86 Federal budget submitted to Congress by the President provides no funding for Federal Revenue Sharing in the third year of its authorization as approved in 1983.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Borough of Goldsboro urges the President and the Pennsylvania Senators and Congressmen to reinsert Federal Revenue Sharing funding in the 1985-86 Federal budget at its fully authorized funding level.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the President, both Senators and our Congressman representing our borough and to the State Association.
