WHEREAS, General Revenue Sharing has become an essential source of revenues through the years in helping us provide the level and quality of programs and services expected by our residents; and


WHEREAS, there are strong indications that the President and Congress intend to terminate this vital program in October, 1986; and

WHEREAS, efforts are underway in the U.S. House of Representatives to extend General Revenue Sharing for another three years at the current level of funding.


