

**GOLDSBORO BOROUGH**  
**RESOLUTION NO. 2001-1**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF GOLDSBORO, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING ALL OUTDOOR OPEN BURNING PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 7, PART 2, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF GOLDSBORO, FOR A PERIOD OF SIXTY (60) DAYS, OR UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, BECAUSE OF DANGEROUSLY DRY CONDITIONS.

*WHEREAS*, Chapter 7, Part 2, of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Goldsboro, regulates the open burning of any material in the Borough and provides that the fire chief may prohibit any open burning for public safety reasons; and

*WHEREAS*, because of dangerously dry conditions in the Borough, the open burning of any material poses an immediate and substantial risk of causing or developing into an uncontrolled fire; and

*WHEREAS*, the fire chief has asked the Borough Council to adopt and disseminate a Resolution prohibiting the open burning of any material in the Borough of Goldsboro for a period of sixty (60) days, or until further notice, for public safety purposes.

*NOW, THEREFORE*, be it resolved by the Borough Council of the Borough of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, that:


1. Pursuant to Chapter 7, Part 2, of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Goldsboro, all open burning of any material in the Borough of Goldsboro is hereby prohibited.
2. The open burning prohibited by this Resolution includes, but is not limited to, any fire set for recreational or ceremonial purposes, and any fire set for the purpose of burning domestic refuse, such as trees, shrubs, leaves, rubbish, and trash.
3. Pursuant to Chapter 7, Part 2, of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Goldsboro, any person, firm, or corporation who shall violate this temporary prohibition of open burning of materials in the Borough shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days.


4. The prohibition of open burning shall become effective immediately upon adoption of this Resolution, and shall remain in effect for a period of sixty (60) days unless said prohibition is lifted sooner by the fire chief.


